Meet a new chamber member:

Critters without Litters – the name says it all

Humboldt Humane is a nonprofit organization doing low-cost spaying and neutering of dogs and cats. Newly opened last month in a bright facility at 307A Fernbridge Drive, just south of the now-closed Angelina's Woodfired Kitchen, it has the catchy name, Critters without Litters, on its signage and on the business card Executive Director Kari Crockett, hands a visitor with a smile.

Jennifer Raymond, who formerly ran Humboldt Spay and Neuter, started the organization in 2022. The board includes Amanda Carter, Rio Dell mayor pro-tem. Crockett was capping off a 30-year career in education and applied to be a receptionist but was recruited by Raymond to be its head.

People can make their own appointments online. Separate intake areas are set up for dogs and cats, to reduce stress on the animals while they are examined and prepped for surgery and given any additional treatment, such as vaccines, that the owners request. Provisions are made for feral cats arriving in a live trap. There are separate rooms for surgery and recovery, where cats will be returned to the carriers in which they arrived, and gleaming kennels will house dogs.

Pricing will be \$75 for a male cat and \$125 for a female, Crockett said, and the cost for dogs, between \$250 and \$350, based on weight. They will have to be under 65 pounds as there is no lift at the facility. These fees are less than what traditional veterinary offices charge, Crockett noted. In addition, there is a list of financial resources available to further lower the cost on the website, Humboldthumane.org.

"We hope we will be able to never turn anyone away," she explains, and she will seek grants, but granting organizations want to see a two-year history of an organization before designating funds, so that will have to wait. Donations and fundraisers have helped launch the organization so far.

Dr. Anne Bayer will be the main veterinarian, Crockett says. Dr. Bayer moved to Eureka after holding positions including at the Open Door Veterinary Clinic in Asheville, North Carolina, and as senior director of medicine at Humane Alliance, a program of the ASPCA (American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals) at the University of Tennessee. Dr. Cody Johns, a veterinarian with the Ferndale and Fortuna practices collectively called Humboldt Veterinary Group, will work with the organization one day per week.

Vet techs and assistants (pictured, with Crockett in a sling) will assist. Volunteers will staff the front desk. The facility will be open Monday through Thursday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. and it is envisioned there will be 35 spay or neuter surgeries performed per day.



A Brief Introduction to AI




