Early voting starts this month

Ballots for the Nov. 5 election will be mailed to all registered voters early this month. Voting options include mailing the completed ballot back in the postage-paid envelope, putting it in a dedicated drop box between Oct. 7 and 8 p.m. Nov. 5 (there will be one at Ray's Food Place, 2009 Main in Fortuna) or bringing it to a voting center, open Sat., Oct. 26 through Tues., Nov. 5. The closest will be the Veterans Building, 1426 Main Street, Fortuna. Voting centers are open 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on early voting days and 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. on election day.

Those planning to vote in person are reminded to watch for their mailed ballot and bring it to the voting location where it can be dropped off. Those not having a ballot when they arrive to vote will need to vote provisionally, if the records indicate a ballot was sent, which takes extra steps and slows down the line, and also slows the ballot-counting process as election workers need to ensure those voting provisionally have not turned in their mailed ballots before the provisional ones are counted.

Those not registered to vote – and who have therefore not received a ballot – can do so until October 21. This can be done at the elections office at 2426 6th Street in Eureka, or go to **registertovote.ca.gov** to register online – you will need your driver's license or state ID card number and the last four digits of your Social Security number.

In addition to presidential, state and referendum measures, this would be an election in which people choose from city council, school board, and community service district candidates. Locally, however, there are no contests. In Rio Dell, two city council members are up for re-election, Amanda Carter and Frank Wilson; both have filed to run for re-election and their names will appear on the ballot, but being without opposition, they will be seated for new terms in December.

Similarly, there are no contests in the Scotia Community Services District, where one incumbent, Susan Pryor, filed for re-election and no one sought the second seat that will become available in December. According to Christina Strevey of the county elections board, in this situation a director could be appointed to fill the vacancy, which would need to be approved by the county board of supervisors.

In the case of the Rio Dell school district, only one candidate, Valerie Barrote, came in to file for re-election, with another seat remaining empty. In the Scotia board there were three seats that expire in December with no candidates. In the Fortuna Union High School board, incumbent Gabriel Winter Charlton filed for one of the four-year positions and another four-year seat, as well as a two-year seat, will expire in December. School boards in this situation would appoint someone to the empty positions but county board approval is not needed for school district boards.

Rio Dell police remind pet owners of rules

The Rio Dell police department reminds pet owners of an existing municipal code, section 6.05.050, Animals Running at Large, which says no owner shall permit his animal, wild or domestic (except a domestic cat) to run at large within the city.

Once a loose dog is captured and taken to the police station, efforts will be made to find the owner based on a license, identification tags or information on the collar, scanning the dog for a microchip, and posting a photo of the dog on social media. An owner, once located, may be required to pay fees before the dog is released, based on how many times the dog has been impounded, if it is licensed, and if it is spayed or neutered.

If the owner is not located in a reasonable time, the dog will be taken to Miranda's Rescue in Fortuna. The owner will then need to pay any fees due at the Rio Dell police station and get a receipt or animal release form which must be shown to staff at Miranda's, before the dog can be released. If it is not spayed or neutered, an additional fee will be due to Miranda's which will go towards an appointment for having the procedure performed. **Continued Page 2.**

Owners are required to license their pets. To do so, bring a current rabies certificate one gets from the veterinarian, to the police department. Prices are based on the length of the rabies shot and whether the animal has been spayed or neutered.

Other reminders the police department shares with residents regarding animals is that no crowing roosters are allowed in a residential or multifamily zone of the city, and that it is unlawful for anyone to own more than three dogs or cats four months of age or older, except as stated within the city's animal control chapter.




