

COUNTDOWN TO WILDWOOD DAYS

The annual community festival is less than two months away, taking place July 31 to August 3. With many traditional activities on offer, some new things will be introduced.

One is an expanded bicycling event, initiated last year by Wally Coppini of Rio Dell. This year it will offer four courses: 36 miles, 56 miles, 65 miles and 100 miles. The latter follows the 100 mile Tour of the Unknown Coast, a "century" ride founded in 1978 but discontinued this year due to a paperwork snag experienced by the board that traditionally puts on the race.

"We're bringing it back to Rio Dell, which used to be where the race began," Coppini says, noting that he hopes 200 riders will participate, bringing new energy to town. Out of towners can camp at the school property Friday night and enjoy the Kiwanis pancake breakfast before starting out Saturday morning. Coppini is eager to get out the word, and hopes the race is so successful that it stays a part of Wildwood Days in future years. He is seeking small donations or sponsorships to help fund event expenses such as insurance, restrooms, advertising and food.

Also on Saturday, August 2 will be the parade, again free and open to all. With the fire department keeping the western theme a third year, the Chamber of Commerce, which puts on the parade, is using the theme Feel the Spirit of the West. Parade applications can be downloaded from the home page of the chamber website, riodellscotiachamber.org — or pick one up at the staging area the day of the parade. Lineup starts in front of the schools on Center Street at 10:30 and entries need to be in line by 11 a.m. if they wish to be judged. Categories include best overall, best use of theme, and best vehicle.



Always ensure these tools are up-to-date and functioning properly to maintain the best level of protection possible. No home or business computer should be without malware protection. 

New program seeks to aid special needs individuals

Rio Dell Police Chief Josh Phinney notes that the department, together with the Rio Dell Community Resource Center, will launch a Blue Envelope program this month, described as a compassionate, safety-focused initiative designed to assist individuals with autism, developmental delays or physical impairments during interactions with law enforcement or emergency medical responders. It is open to residents of both Rio Dell and Scotia, and is a voluntary effort meant to empower individuals and families with resources to help create calmer, more informed interactions in situations that can sometimes be overwhelming or misunderstood.

Participants will receive what Phinney calls visible swag such as vehicle decals, wallet cards and lanyards to signal to law enforcement and other responders that a person is a program participant.
