Spring Clean-up comes to Rio Dell

Saturday, May 10 will be the annual chance for Rio Dell residents to get rid of bulky waste from their homes and yards, for free. It will happen from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Eagle Prairie Elementary School, 95 Center St., Rio Dell. The popularity of the event, and the firm 1 p.m. end time makes getting in line early that day recommended. Items that are accepted include furniture, yard trimmings, scrap wood, old appliances, and scrap metal. Those planning to attend are reminded the line moves faster when waste is separated in the vehicle for easy removal, with trash, wood and metal in that order.

Items that will not be accepted include household trash, tires, e-waste, hazardous waste and construction waste.

E-waste can be dropped off at the Recology Recycling Center, 965 Riverwalk Drive, Fortuna.

There is a \$2 charge for each item dropped off there.

Hoby's Market - Meet an advertiser

A steady flow of working men and women pour into Hoby's Market at 105 Main Street in Scotia at noon for their lunch. "They know to come here because we feed them right," Kendra Harralson, assistant manager at the store, says. "The mill, Cal-Trans, Wright Tree Service, all come here." Some come for the deli offerings and others, on Wednesdays and Fridays, for the barbeque, staffed outside

by Kenny the meat manager. "We like to give customers a choice," he notes, opening the cover on his grill to show that day it's tri tip and a dish he calls chicken barbeque that also has sausage and bacon, served on a bun. "It's got a bit

of a kick," he says, offering a sample on a spoon. "We usually sell out. I sold 47 lunches today," he adds. At the deli counter, people can order meat, cheese or veggie trays to take with them, for instance for the senior lunch at the Rio Dell Community Resource Center. Manager Heather Hatten has been with Hoby's for 20 years. "Half my life," she smiles. She notes that the store has 18 employees and for the past three years has been owned by a corporate entity, Heer Petroleum. Jared Livella is the district supervisor. Hoby's has seen a lot of history. It was started by Herb Colby who now lives in Fortuna and still comes by to visit. It burned

down in the gas explosion caused by an earthquake in 1992.

A photo taken at the time shows the business engulfed in flames. About \$30,000 in damage was caused by the earthquakes that rocked the area in December 2022 and

January 2023 according to news reports. In places throughout the store today, wires are stretched across the shelves to prevent the contents from falling in another quake. Looking to the future, Hatten says changes continue to be made, such as new equipment that has been purchased for the deli.

City supports state disaster-aide legislation

The City of Rio Dell authored a letter of support for AB262, the California Individual Assistance Act, which calls for establishing a grant program to provide financial assistance to those impacted by a disaster not sufficiently large to generate aide under FEMA, the Federal Emergency Management Agency. Additionally, Mayor Debra Garnes spoke last month before a committee of the State Assembly in Sacramento in support of the effort, authored by a Los Angeles-based state representative. Garnes noted that the earthquakes that impacted Rio Dell had to be addressed by philanthropic donations and county aide because state and federal funds were not generated.


