News and Notes

2015 - The Year in Review

On Jan. 24, a new thrift store, Bigfoot's New and Recycled Treasures, opened on Wildwood Avenue. Owners Heidi and Dave Kitchen feature local art among the several rooms of offerings, and have taken an active part in community events.

April brought the annual Easter egg hunt at the firefighters' park. The Community Resource Center moved to its new location at the corner of Monument and Wildwood, and celebrated that with an open house.

The Eagle Prairie Arts District in May launched a monthly community market on the second Saturday of each month, in connection with the monthly Arts on the Avenue activity.

The May event, dubbed Art, Brew & BBQ, featured live music and drew a lot of attention, along with many other things going on that weekend, including a bike safety rodeo sponsored by the Community Resource Center, waste round up, bike tour through the area, and, for Mother's Day, the annual fire department pancake breakfast. A week later, the Fire Auxiliary sponsored the Culpepper & Merriweather Circus.

Eel River Disposal donated a large, gas grill that raised funds for the chamber of commerce during the summer, as people purchased tickets.

The summer saw a full slate of art classes for all ages, offered through the Eagle Prairie Arts District at the gallery it shares with the chamber at 406 Wildwood Ave.

Wildwood Days in August produced a slate of traditional, favorite activities, including live music, the parade, softball and bocci tournaments, mower races, car show and shine, silent auction and firefighters' barbeque. A slew of actual wild fires which kept the department hopping all summer, together with water retrictions around the drought, cancelled the firefighters' muster. Some popular new items were added, including a children's soapbox derby race.

The City of Rio Dell celebrated its 50th anniversary of incorporation during that weekend, bringing several people to town whose familes were among the first city council and city employees. Retired Judge Harold Neville, who had served as Rio Dell's first city attorney, was the grand marshall of the parade and attended the ceremony. A celebratory cake and talk by area historian Jerry Rohde, along with the display of historic, local photos and chance for people to share memories of bygone times, highlighted that event.

Cutie Pie's Boutique opened in Rio Dell on Wildwood Avenue August 28. Owner Amber Bernal highlighted the ribbon cutting with a children's fashion show featuring boys and girls in outfits for every occasion.

Also in August, Tonetta's Restaurant on Wildwood had a grand re-opening under new owner and long-time cook Gladys Batres. It is now called Lety's, and is open for dinner several evenings a week, and featuring some new menu items.

A business survey sponsored by the chamber of commerce that was conducted in June supported the notion business owners wanted support promoting their businesses in the community; this led to a series of chamber mixers, offered twice a month, September through December, bringing together people to learn about businesses as diverse at Aqua Dam, the Scotia Inn, and Monument Mountain Vineyards, as well as other organizations such as the status of the Scotia Pool and Gym, the Town of Scotia and the Rio Dell Volunteer Fire Department. The series is expected to resume in the spring with monthly mixers.

The holiday season took hold with a bang . . . the fire department sold out of Christmas trees in probably record time; the city, fire department and community resource center joined with the chamber to hold a tree lighting ceremony that featured music by the Baptist Church choir and a visit by Santa, as well as refreshments. The Giving Tree program to collect gifts to help needy area children once again received donations from generous community members, and a holiday store at the chamber of commerce in December provided a place for area artists and crafters to sell their items and for local shoppers to purchase quality, locally made gift items.


