- Drinking Water Quality \$136,000,000
- Drinking water for disadvantaged communities \$69,000,000
- Wastewater treatment in small communities \$66,000,000,

## Water Bond Funds Will Target Statewide, Integrated System: Tools to help bring funding to Humboldt County

The voter approved Proposition 1 resulted in 7.5 billion dollars of bond funding to address California's water issues. The rural property owner may have a difficult time targeting, tracking and accessing funding to benefit their land and operations. There are a myriad of agencies that will be disseminating grant funding to implement various bond funded water projects around the state. What follows is an overview of where the money will be dedicated and how it will be distributed. The main areas of focus for property owners and agencies in Humboldt County will be water storage and watershed restoration.

Water Storage Funds Are Continuously Appropriated. State agency departments will select the projects, most funding under the bond (\$5.7 billion) is available only if recipients provide matching funding to support the projects. \$510 million of bond funding is dedicated to regional projects with specific plans developed by local communities. Our region chose to focus on watershed rehabilitation, \$26.5 million has been dedicated to the north coast. Another \$300 million is available to all regions specifically for water conservation and storm water capture. In addition to the dedicated regional allocations, all regions are eligible to compete for \$3 billion available for projects and programs such as recycled water, pipelines, desalination plants, safe drinking water, and groundwater storage / cleanup.

The California Water Action Plan (CWAP), a five-year plan for building an integrated, statewide water system will be the framework for disbursement of the funds through various agencies. The **Department of Water Resources** is accelerating the disbursement of the funds; the **Department of Fish and Wildlife** will release its draft guidelines this month, put out a solicitation package in July, and approve the first set of grant recipients for bond funds by the end of this calendar year. The **California Water Commission** has established the process it will use to award funds for **storage projects** and the **Coastal Conservancy** has proposed grant outlines.

While not an exhaustive list of tools to help property owners and agencies bring funding to Humboldt County, this article intends to help target funding to the benefit of Humboldt County, particularly the agricultural community and agencies with ongoing water issues. In general, we need to prepare for projects that fit the main categories of watershed restoration, and water storage projects, targeting storm water capture but looking closely at groundwater storage projects as well.






