Get ready for Wildwood Days

Wildwood Days will be August 3 to 5 this year, starting like last year on Friday night. The Chamber of Commerce will once again produce the parade, the theme of which is Lest We Forget, honoring the 100th anniversary of Armistice Day, now called Veterans Day, which marked the end of World War I, and veterans from all wars. The sponsor for the parade is Fidelity National Title Company of Eureka which will provide funds for prizes, as well as other expenses.

There will be three categories, **Best Theme-Related Entry, Best Vehicle Entry and Best Overall Entry,** for which entrants may compete for a prize. Parade applications can be downloaded from the chamber's website: riodellscotiachamber.org, or requested by emailing rdschamber@gmail.com. Area war veterans will ride in the grand marshal's car.

Following the parade, there will be a tree planting ceremony in Memorial Park, across Wildwood Avenue from City Hall, at 1:30 p.m. The tree has been donated by Mark Gillam of Rio Dell to honor veterans.

A plaque will be provided by the memorial tree program of Saving Hallowed Grounds, a historic preservation and commemoration non-profit organization that has been working for the past four years nationally to mark the centennial of the First World War.

The ceremony will include the raising of the flag on a 30-foot pole set up for the occasion, a 21-gun salute by the Mad River Community Honor Guard, music by the Dixie Gators band, and taps, played by a team of local buglers.

Harper celebrated its 100th anniversary in 2012, producing a commemorative booklet that traces the company's history. One of the oldest automobile sellers in the U.S., it is the 13th oldest Ford dealer. Founder Harvey Mitchell Harper traveled widely and sampled a number of careers before taking his wife and five of their eventual seven children in a 1912 Ford Model T Touring Car to Eureka from Phoenix to open a Ford dealership there, having seen autos as more than the fad they were considered to be by many in those days.

Harper's great-grandson took over the reins of the dealership in 2007, continuing the family tradition. Community giving is strong in the Harper history, with a page of its website listing donations to myriad non-profit organizations throughout the region.
