

## Introduction to Proxy Servers

You may not know it, but every time you visit a website or connect with someone online, your internet connection gives your “computer address” to the site or person you’re connecting with. This is done so the site or person knows how to get the requested information back to your computer. This “computer address” is technically known as your public Internet Protocol address or simply your “public IP address.” Without it, you wouldn’t be able to do any online activity and other people and services online wouldn’t be able to reach you either. IP addresses are how the online world connects to one another.

### Where does your IP address come from?

Your public IP address comes from your Internet Service Provider or ISP. In our area the most common ISP’s are Suddenlink, AT&T, 101Netlink, or Frontiernet. Whomever you pay for Internet service is responsible for assigning your public IP address, as well as for your Internet connection. Your smart device also uses an IP address when you’re browsing the web or using an app.

Most of us are happy to ignore the details of how all of this Internet stuff works, but there are a few concepts and security concerns about public IP addresses that we should be aware of as responsible Internet citizens. For example:

- Your IP address identifies where you are in the world.
- It links your name and home address to your IP address. Your name and information are used to purchase the Internet service, and the service provider gives you your public IP address thereby creating a direct link to you.

## Meet a Silver Member of the Chamber: Dayle’s Diesel and Generator

**Dayle Lawrence** moved his business to the Scotia industrial park two years ago after outgrowing his former location, on the property of White-thorn Construction in Whitethorn, which had been his base for 20 years. He now uses 30,000 square feet of the cavernous yellow building shared with Hall’s Sheet Metal, Eel River Brewing and Aqua Dam to house the rows of portable generators of the kind you tow behind a truck, that he has for sale.



Construction companies are a major customer base, he notes.

Lawrence employs four people to sell and fix generators, who travel to “wherever I’m paid to go,” as he says, to fill a need. That has taken him to Orick, Laytonville and Whale Gulch among other off-the-track places.

He moved to the area from the Sacramento Valley in 1993 and relies on word of mouth, Craigslist and a phone book ad to let people know about his services. With one year left on a three-year lease at his present location, he fears he might need to move as the Scotia properties are sold. “I bought a house here in Scotia so I’m not going far,” he notes. As a silver member of the Chamber of Commerce, he is helping the area by supplying funds towards projects the chamber undertakes, such as the expanded lighting of the area at Christmas and the Wildwood Days parade.

Many people are not comfortable with their personal information being so readily available on the Internet. If it bothers you as well, there are a few things you can do to make it more difficult to directly link your public IP to your other personal information. A solid first step is to use a proxy service or proxy server.

### So what is a "proxy server"?

The word proxy means "substitute." In computer networks, a proxy server is a server that acts as an intermediary for requests from clients seeking resources from other servers. It works like this: a client (you) uses a web browser to visit the psa-2.com support website, and your browser is set up to use a proxy server. After you type psa-2.com into your browser address bar, the request is sent to the proxy server. The proxy server then sends the request on to my server where psa-2.com is hosted. The homepage of my website is returned to the proxy server which then returns my homepage to your browser for viewing. This results in my website seeing the proxy server as the visitor, not you.

### What Are The Benefits?

Now that you know the basics of how a proxy service or proxy server works, let's see what the benefits are for you. Proxy servers can hide your IP address (if they are set to do this), can send a different user agent so that your browser is not identified and can block cookies or accept them but not pass them to your PC or device. Therefore, when using a proxy server, you can be a lot more anonymous than when using a direct connection to the Internet.

Proxy servers may also have a role in improving security, especially when used in business networks. They can be set to block access to malicious websites that distribute malware and they can also provide encryption services so that your data is not easily mined by third parties.

### Fair Warning

Using proxy servers is not all about benefits and good stuff. They can pose problems as well, such as:

- When using unencrypted connections, the proxy server can alter the responses you receive, both in good and bad ways. For example, an infected or malicious proxy server can be used to load malware into your browser or redirect you to a phishing website.

- A proxy can alter the requests you make to a website or service on the Internet to generate results that meet someone else's intentions.

- A proxy server monitors and logs your activity. Therefore, it stores lots of information about you that can be used for identification at a later date.

- Depending on how it was configured, a proxy server can provide unencrypted data where encrypted data was previously provided by the website or service you are using. This can expose you to network sniffing and having others monitor what you are doing on the Internet.

## Bridge painting continues while businesses express concern

Painting of the Eagle Prairie bridge between Rio Dell and Scotia, which started in mid-March, continues while area businesses seek to mitigate what they fear will be damage to their traffic flow this tourist season as a result of the bridge closure to vehicular traffic. Cal Trans staffers acknowledged that the standard process for informing a community in advance of such a project was not followed, catching business owners by surprise and without a chance to weigh in on options.



Cal Trans staff members have sought to help offset the predicted damage to the bottom line of businesses dependent on tourist traffic, with signage and a speeded-up completion timetable. Meeting with area businesses individually as well as at chamber of commerce events, and with the Rio Dell City Council April 3, several Cal Trans officials have received recommendations from businesses on how to more effectively place signs to lead travelers into town and into the business area. Some business owners are also considering other options such as applying for funding available from Cal Trans to mitigate lost business, which many are already noting they have experienced, dating from the time of the bridge closure. Noting that several new businesses have opened in the area only to be hit with this set-back, several in the business community have predicted that not all the current businesses will weather the season.

Cal Trans meanwhile has looked at possibilities to speed up the six-month closure time initially anticipated for the bridge project, noting that keeping one lane open, as was done when the bridge was last painted over a decade ago, a move which the businesses favored, did not prove feasible financially or for safety considerations. The process would extend the project to more than a year and cost \$2 million additionally, while creating potential danger if travelers become impatient waiting for their turn to cross the single-lane bridge, and made unsafe choices, which led to a couple injuries when the bridge was last painted.

## Gold-Level chamber member moves office to Wildwood

**Archaeological Research and Supply Company**, a gold-level member of the Rio Dell-Scotia Chamber of Commerce, has opened an office at 440 Wildwood Avenue in Rio Dell, a space which formerly housed Linda Barsanti's hair salon.
